ABOUT THE HERE PROJECT

The Hub for European Refugee Education (HERE) collates, fosters and disseminates research and knowledge for academics and practitioners interested in the question:

'What do we know about the educational provision for and experiences of children and young people from refugee backgrounds who have arrived in Europe since 2015?'

The overarching goal is for HERE to become a sustainable Europe wide base for policy makers, researchers, agencies and relevant bodies, practitioners and other interested parties.

ABOUT THE HERE PROJECT

HERE Website

Hosts the HERE database which is accessible to policy makers, researchers, agencies and relevant bodies. Supports the HERE knowledge base and networking activity.

HERE Database

A curation of published information and articles about refugee education across Europe from academic and non-academic sources since 2015 in a new online, searchable database.

HERE Network

Bringing together key stakeholders in the field of refugee education through online and related activity aimed at exchanging knowledge and developing research and practices on refugee education across Europe.

WHAT WE SEARCHED

INCLUSION CRITERIA

INCLUDE IF:

Journal article; Masters & doctoral theses & dissertations; Reports; Conference proceedings; Book chapters; Books; Blog posts

Refers to arrivals since 2011, but published in/since 2015

Refers to 'refugee', 'forced migrant', 'displaced', 'asylum seeker', etc...

Focuses on the issue of gendered outcomes and experiences

Is published in English

Has at least 1 section on education, among other topics (can also focus on teaching about refugees/forced migration)

Refers to research from Europe (at least 1 European country included)

EXCLUSION CRITERIA

EXCLUDE IF:

News article; press release; social media post; reference work entry; bachelor-level dissertation; book review; data table

Refers to those who arrived before 2011

Refers only to 'migrant' or 'immigrant'

Focuses primarily on health (including medical education)




EDUCATION LEVEL




EDUCATION TYPE


